
Individual Education Plan

- The individual educational plan (IEP) documents the services required to meet student's needs. The Individual with Disabilities Education Act of 2004 (IDEA) governs services provided to students with disabilities who attend public school. School districts must follow established procedures to identify and evaluate students who are suspected of having a disability.
- An IEP is a **public school document** and may be used when converting to a Services Plan for parentally placed private school students

Services Plan

A Services Plan (SP) is developed and implemented to the extent appropriate for each **private school student** with a disability who has been designated to receive special education and related services offered by the school district. The SP must be developed by a team and reviewed at least annually.



IEP vs. Services Plan

- Children with disabilities enrolled in public schools are entitled to FAPE and must receive the full range of services under IDEA Part B that are necessary to meet the child's individual needs through a developed Individual Education Plan (IEP).
- <u>Services Plans</u> are limited and only provide the services determined by the school district. PPPSS are not entitled to FAPE in the private schools
