

PUBLIC CONDUCT ON SCHOOL PROPERTY

FILE: KFA

TITLE: Alcohol, Alcoholic Beverages, Mood-Modifying Substances

POLICY:

No person shall be in possession of or be under the influence of an intoxicating beverage or an illegal mood or behavior-modifying substance while on school property, at school-sponsored activities or while on school trips involving students.

(1) All principals are hereby, directed to advise individuals who have an alcoholic beverage in their possession to leave the school premises immediately.

(2) Persons having purchased an admission ticket to a school event shall forfeit their rights under this rule by having an alcoholic beverage in their possession at the event.

(3) Any person who has been given notice by a school official and either fails to leave the premises or leaves, but returns to the premises in possession of an alcoholic beverage, shall be deemed a trespasser. The police or other proper law enforcement agency shall be notified to arrest the trespasser.

(4) The provisions of this rule shall apply equally to any person under the influence of or in the possession of an alcoholic beverage.

(5) School board employees who violate this rule shall be considered guilty of conduct which seriously impairs their effectiveness as employees and shall be subject to such discipline as the school board determines under the provisions of Sections 230.23(5)(f); 230.33(7)(e); and, 231.28, Florida Statutes.

TITLE: Disruptions at School Board Functions

POLICY:

No person shall knowingly disrupt or interfere with a school board function or activity on school board property. This includes persons who knowingly advise, counsel or instruct any student or school board employee to disrupt any school board function or activity. The school board chairman, superintendent or designee shall inform persons who are disrupting or interfering with a school board function or activity that they may be found guilty of a second degree misdemeanor. Such persons shall be advised to immediately leave the premises.

(1) Persons who purchased an admission ticket to a school event shall forfeit their rights under this rule by having disrupted or interfered with the event.

(2) Any person who has been given notice by a school official and either fails to leave the premises or leaves the premises and subsequently returns to the premises shall be deemed a trespasser. The police or other proper law enforcement agency shall be notified to arrest the trespasser.
