

Grandfathered Transfer

A Grandfathered Transfer is available:

- For a student who has been rezoned by OCPS two or more times during a school level (K-5, 6-8, 9-12) at the current address
- For a student who has been rezoned from an established school to another established school. In this case, the student may remain at the existing school instead of being assigned to the rezoned school
- For a student who will be in the 5th or 8th grade and will be rezoned to a new relief elementary or middle school

Grandfathered Transfer

The following shall apply to Grandfathered Transfers:

- Transportation is not provided by OCPS
- Siblings may be eligible to transfer with the student who is granted the Grandfathered Transfer, so long as the school has an available seat for the sibling and is not over capacity. In addition, the transfer for the sibling will only be available for one school year.
- Deadline to apply: April 30, 2024, for targeted rezoning(s) April 30, 2025, for relief school(s)





Growth Eastern Orange County: Elementary







Proximity Transfer

- Must live within two miles of the requested school for middle and high schools
- Must live within one mile of the requested school for elementary schools
- School must have capacity as determined by the Office of Student Enrollment (looking to use 95% as the threshold for school capacity)
- If the student moves outside of the established radius, the transfer becomes null and void
- Transfer is open year-round
- Transfer is first come, first served
- Siblings may be eligible so long as the school has an available seat

Proximity Transfer - Example




Students living in the hashed area will be eligible for Proximity Transfer to go to Apopka MS.

There are 250 students eligible from Wolf Lake MS and 159 eligible from Piedmont Lakes MS.

Student Enrollment will determine the number of seats available for the transfer.




Students living in the hashed area will be eligible for Proximity Transfer to go to Apopka HS.



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


