Question: Does the family income affect whether they are covered by the Act? Answer: Generally, No. The McKinney-Vento Act's definition of homelessness centers on the student's living arrangement. There are no specific income limits. There may be situations in which a relatively affluent family may be considered (such as a woman fleeing a domestic violence situation). Statistically, the mean income of families experiencing homelessness is less than half the federal poverty level.
