Did you know?

Children and youth experiencing homelessness have the right to attend either the school of origin or the local attendance area school.

School of origin is defined as the school that the child or youth attended when permanently housed or the school in which the child or youth was last enrolled.

Local attendance area school is defined as any public school that non-homeless students who live in the attendance zone in which the child or youth is actually living are eligible to attend.
