The Tribute

The Melody Burton Scholarship for Future Teachers was established in 1995 by the Foundation for Orange County Public Schools, Inc. The scholarship commemorates the life and education of Melody Burton, a teacher in Orange County Public Schools district who lost her battle with cancer in 1993.

The scholarship is administered by the Human Resources Department of Orange County Public Schools and was funded by a grant from the Foundation for Orange County Public Schools, Inc.



The purpose of the Melody Burton Scholarship is to increase the number of high quality teachers available for Orange County school district classrooms. Critical areas are identified each year by the school district. The endorsement will provide financial assistance for the **OCPS paraprofessional or classroom assistant (program assistant)** interested in teaching in these critical areas.

The Agreement

The scholarship recipient (s) are expected to teach at least three years in Orange County Public Schools following completion of **Baccalaureate Degree in Education.** The tuition loan will be forgiven upon completion of three years in a full-time instructional position with the Orange County Public School District.

If the Melody Burton scholar does not accept employment with Orange County Public Schools or fails to complete the program, repayment of the scholarship is required. The loan will be forgiven if the school system is unable to offer employment within one year of program completion.

IMPORTANT ELIGIBILTY NOTICE:

- Scholar must be **currently** enrolled in a college or university in order to qualify for the scholarship.
- Applicant must be in a **paraprofessional or classroom assistant** (**program assistant**) **position** currently working in Orange County Public School, and must have completed an A.A degree or have at least 60 college credit hours but not have a Bachelors degree.
- Preference will be given to applicants currently working in a "highneeds" school.
- Financial assistance for tuition shall be awarded based on the number of qualified recipients per year.

Application Checklist

- ⇒Complete application Pages 3-5
- ⇒An official statement of all financial assistance applied for or awarded from the college/university. Must indicate the original amount, amount awarded, and the remaining balance (what you owe).
- ⇒Attach college transcript (s) showing 60 credit hours or an AA degree earned.
- ⇒Three (3) letters of recommendations from community leaders, school administrators, teachers and/or employers.
- ⇒One page essay responding to the question, "Why I have chosen a career in education and how will this scholarship benefit me?" Be sure to include the degree you are seeking and critical subject area you would like to teach.

The Program Participants hereby agree to:

- Be currently enrolled in a college or university (must provide proof)
- Maintain a GPA of 2.5 on a scale of 4.0 for each semester and cumulatively.
- Maintain regular attendance.
- Abstain from use of illegal drugs.
- Be a law abiding citizen.
- Complete postsecondary education within a five-year period of time.
- Provide an official transcript and financial statement at the beginning of each semester and at the end of each semester.
- Submit a written statement at the end of each semester, which indicates a continued desire to become a certified teacher for Orange County Public Schools.
- Committing to teach for Orange County Public Schools district for 3 years.
- **Scholarship Renewal:** Renewable yearly on the condition that the recipient maintains a 2.5 or higher grade point average, provide current transcript, submit a current financial statement, and sends an annual thank you letter to the donor.

A student who fails a component of this agreement or does not make expected progress may be placed on probationary status for a period not to exceed two semesters or be removed from the program by written recommendation of the program administrator.

Any student on probation who fails to achieve satisfactory progress on all components of the agreement for two successive semesters shall be removed from the program.

If the student complies with the terms of this agreement, the Melody Burton Scholarship program sponsored by The Foundation for Orange County Schools will endeavor to provide financial assistance toward completing the requirement for a bachelor's degree in education and assistance with placement upon graduation.
